

Year 4

- add the suffixes -ing and -ed to words ending in -e with a consonant before it
- add the suffixes -ing and -ed to words ending in -y with a consonant before it
- add -er and -est to a root word ending in -y and -e with a consonant before it
- add suffixes beginning with vowel letters to words of more than one syllable
- spell words where *ch* makes a *k* sound
