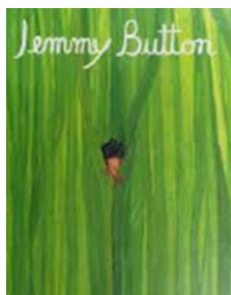


## Year 6 Curriculum Overview - Spring Term 2

In our topic we will learn how to:

- ✓ Use passive voice

## Homework Expectations

- ✓ Log onto Times Table Rock stars at least three times a week. Strong times table knowledge is a key part of being able to complete the maths SATs successfully and will help your child to complete many other parts of the maths curriculum with ease).
- ✓ Log onto Spelling Frame each week. Practise any areas of spelling that you find difficult. **Complete the assigned test that has been set by the class teacher.**
- ✓ Complete the maths or grammar/punctuation tasks set by your teacher. We will put these online but will also provide paper copies if requested.
- ✓ Read at least three times a week. It would be amazing if the children could read with an adult and talk about what they have read.

## SATs Club!

**Starts Tuesday 05<sup>th</sup> March**

Each Tuesday, we will be inviting our year 6s to join us for SATs club. We would love to see as many pupils as possible attend.

During SATs club, we revise areas of the curriculum that pupils will need to know for their upcoming SATs tests. We do this through a range of activities (including games) and online quizzes. This has proven to be a beneficial booster session for many of our past year 6 pupils.

This will run until 4:10 and pupils can be collected from the KS2 playground as normal.

## Swimming

As informed on the newsletter before half term, we now have a heated swimming pool on-site. From the 26<sup>th</sup> February until Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March, pupils in year 5 & 6 will be taking part in a daily 30 minute swimming lesson. This will replace our usual PE sessions this half term. Therefore, pupils will not need to come in PE kit on Mondays and Wednesdays until after the Easter holidays. **All pupils, however, need to bring their swimming costume/trunks, a swimming hat and a towel each day for the three weeks. Pupils will also need suitable footwear (flip-flops or crocs) to walk to and from the pool in.**

The children will be taught in small groups by a qualified instructor and a lifeguard will be present. I am sure that the children will enjoy this opportunity! This is part of the national curriculum and is a compulsory lesson for all.
